The word 'Selah' comes to us from the world of music. When a composer put 'Selah' into his music, he was calling for a rest, a pause or a hush.

IMPOSSIBLE



Lesson 1 (vs1-2): It's not as bad as it seems; Pause and talk to God! He is waiting for you to come to Him.

1 Kings 18:41-46 - Elijah Prays for Rain

⁴¹ Then Elijah said to Ahab, "Go get something to eat and drink, for I hear a mighty rainstorm coming!" ⁴² So Ahab went to eat and drink. But Elijah climbed to the top of Mount Carmel and bowed low to the ground and prayed with his face between his knees. ⁴³ Then he said to his servant, "Go and look out toward the sea." The servant went and looked, then returned to Elijah and said, "I didn't see anything." Seven times Elijah told him to go and look.

44 Finally the seventh time, his servant told him, "I saw a little cloud about the size of a man's hand rising from the sea." Then Elijah shouted, "Hurry to Ahab and tell him, 'Climb into your chariot and go back home. If you don't hurry, the rain will stop you!"

45 And soon the sky was black with clouds. A heavy wind brought a terrific rainstorm, and Ahab left quickly for Jezreel.

46 Then the LORD gave special strength to Elijah. He tucked his cloak into his belt[] and ran ahead of Ahab's chariot all the way to the entrance of Jezreel.

Lesson 2 (vs3-6): It's not as bad as it seems when we make our situation about God and not about us. Then things gets clearer and we are able to think straight.
