**11 “I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.
12 But a hireling, he who is not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf catches the sheep and scatters them.
13 The hireling flees because he is a hireling and does not care about the sheep.
14 I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep and am known by My own.”**

I. Jesus is the Good Shepherd (vv12-13).

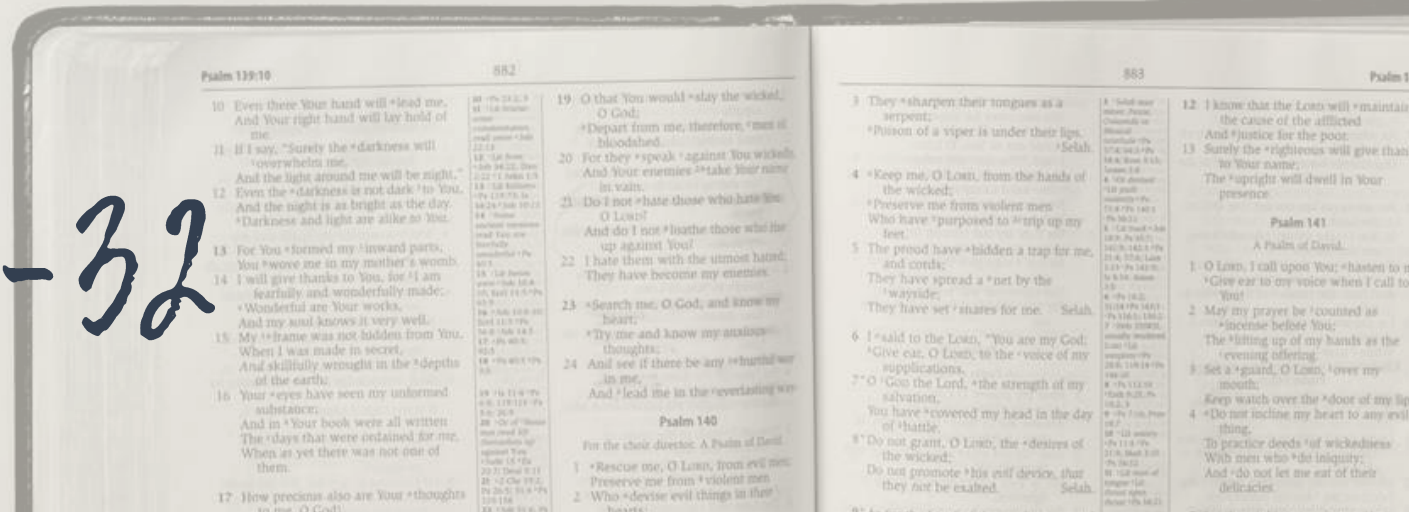
- good vs. bad shepherd
- their tasks





Then the Jews took up stones again to stone Him. Jesus answered them, “Many good works I have shown you from My Father. For which of those works do you stone Me?”

II. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, cares for you like no other (vv 11-14).

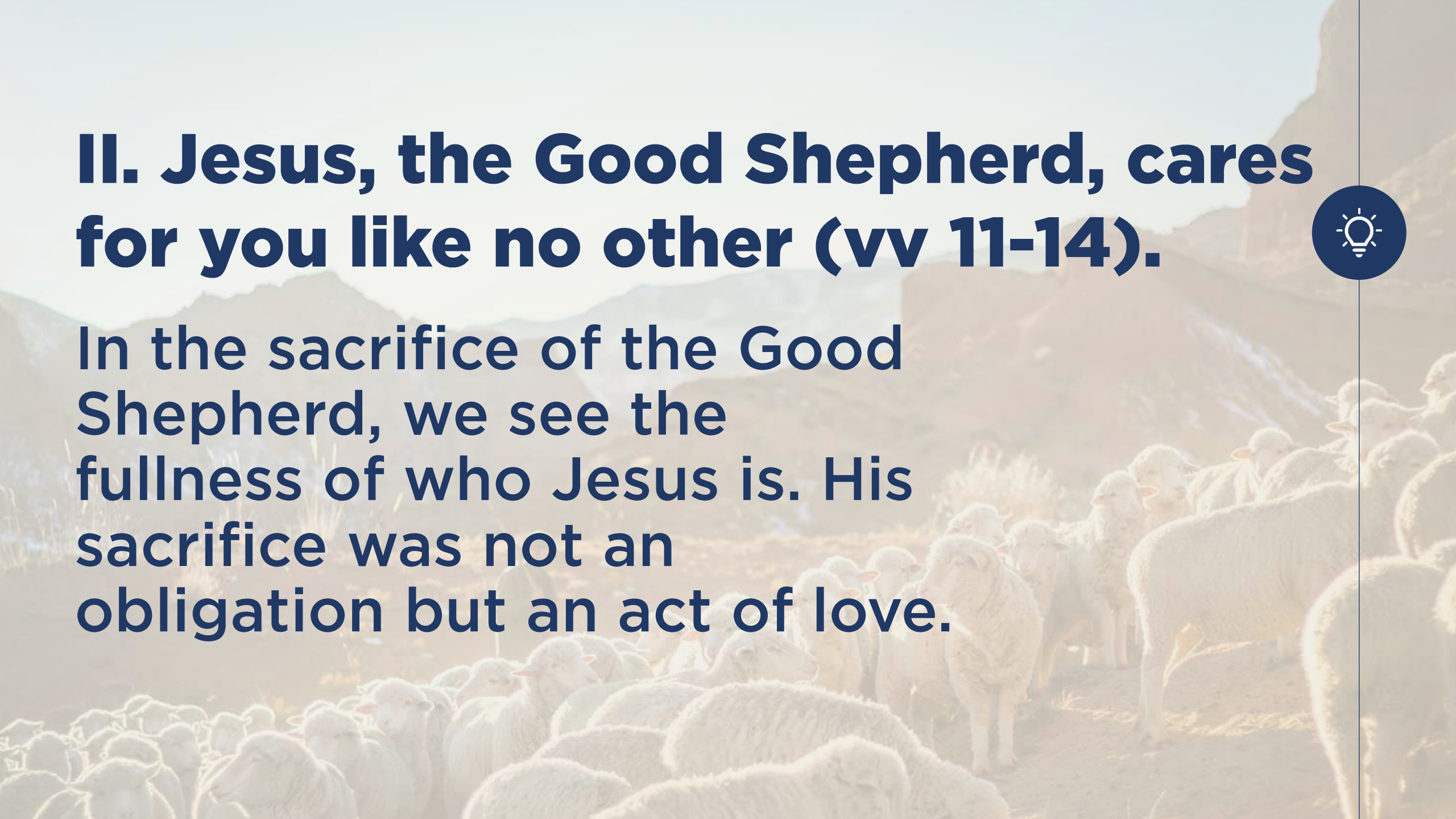


- will die for His sheep (v11)
- will protect His sheep against dangers (v12)
- has personal knowledge of His sheep and vice versa (v14, 25-27).

II. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, cares for you like no other (vv 11-14).



In the sacrifice of the Good Shepherd, we see the fullness of who Jesus is. His sacrifice was not an obligation but an act of love.



- **In the original Greek, the word used for “shepherd” in this passage is “POIMEN.”**
- **Poimen is used throughout the New Testament**
 - Not only to literal shepherds
 - But also to spiritual leaders



And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers.”

Ephesians 4:11

The word “pastors” here is the same word as “poimen.”
