Isaiah 7:14

“Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.”

A. Virgin Birth's – Doctrinal Importance

Matthew 1:18

1. Jesus had a human body

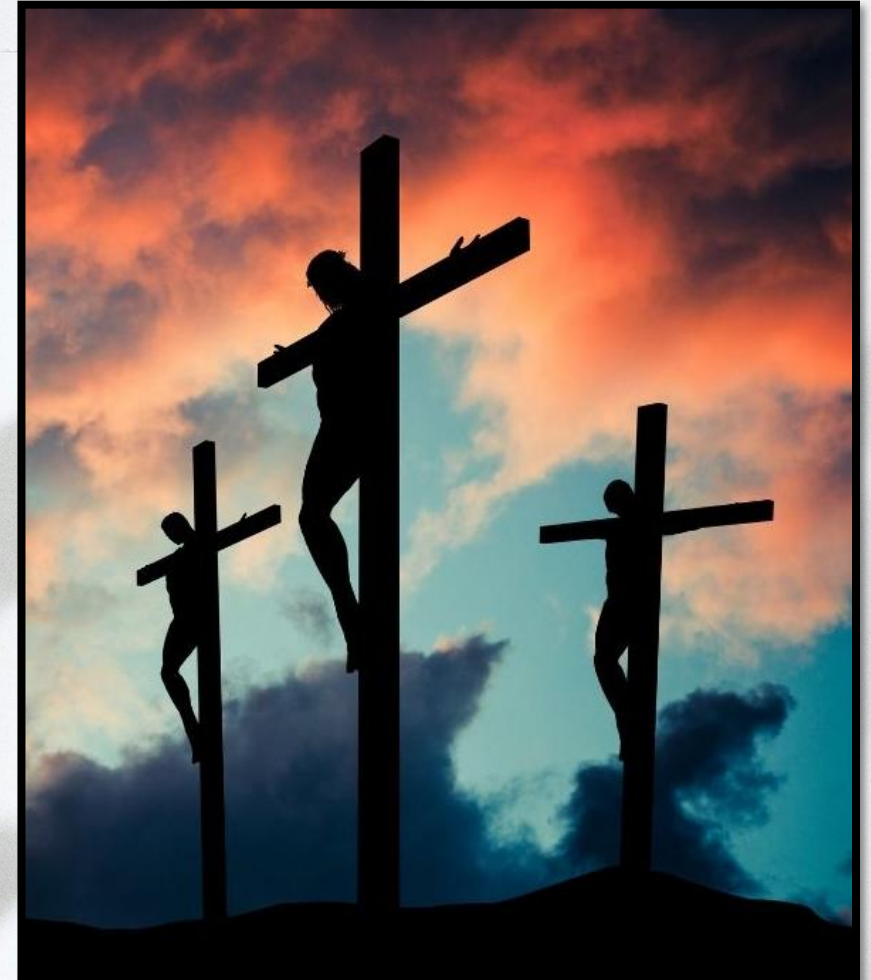
- **He hunger and thirst**

1. Jesus had a human body

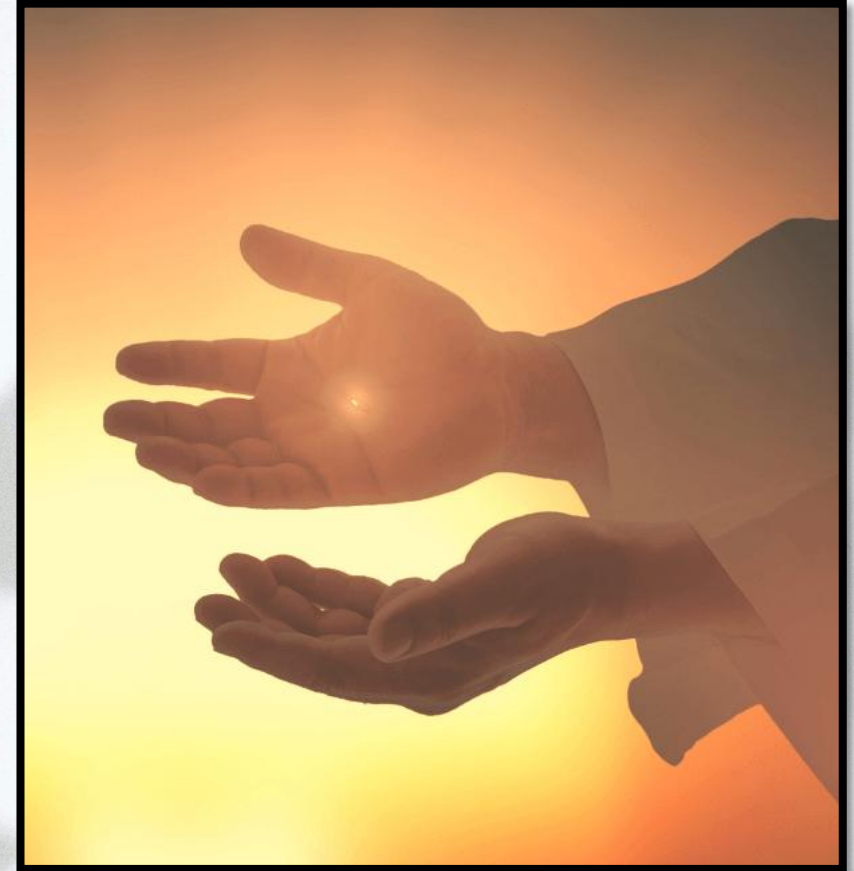
- **He resurrected from dead**

“They gave him, a piece of broiled fish”

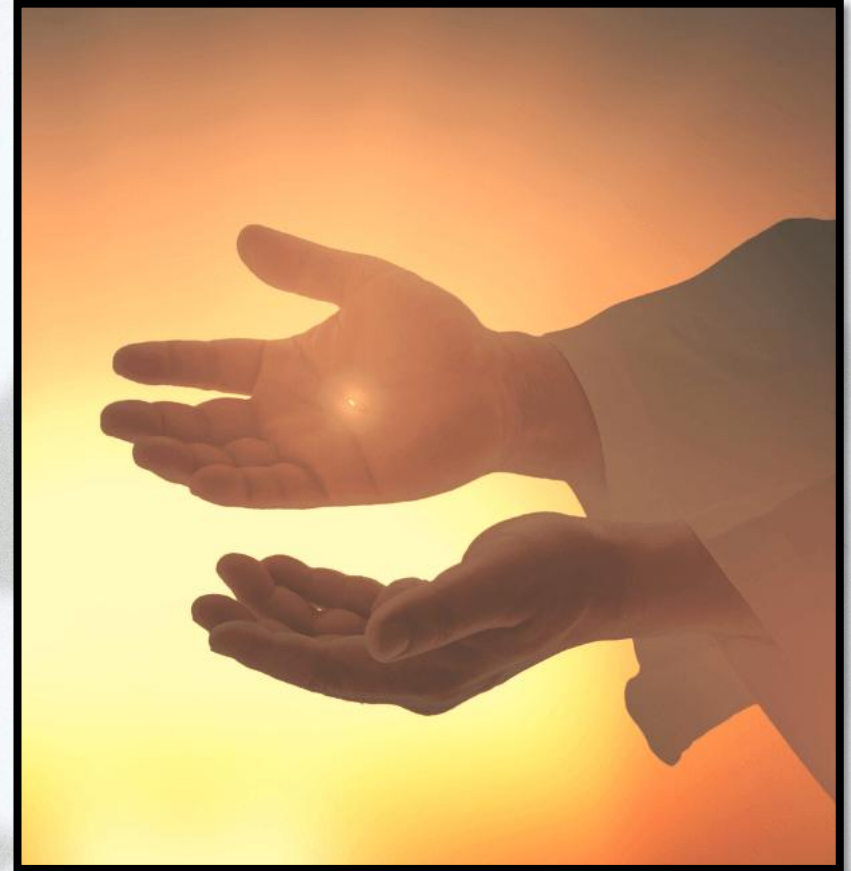


1. Jesus had a human body

John 16:28

“I came from the Father and entered the world; now I am leaving the world and going back to the Father.”

“After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.



2. Jesus had a human mind

Luke 2:52

“And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.

Hebrews 5:8

“Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered”

Mark 13:32

“But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

John 12:27

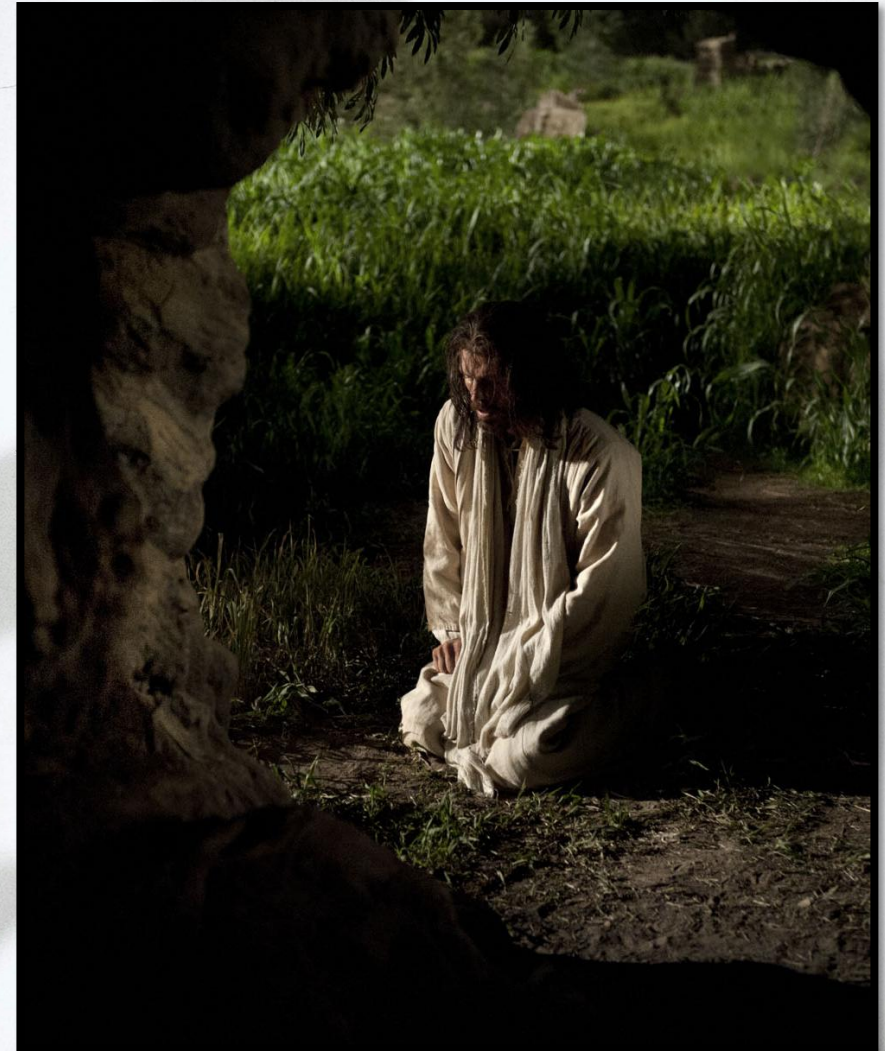
“**Now my soul is troubled**, and what shall I say? ‘Father, save me from this hour’? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour.”

“Then he said to them, “My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me.”



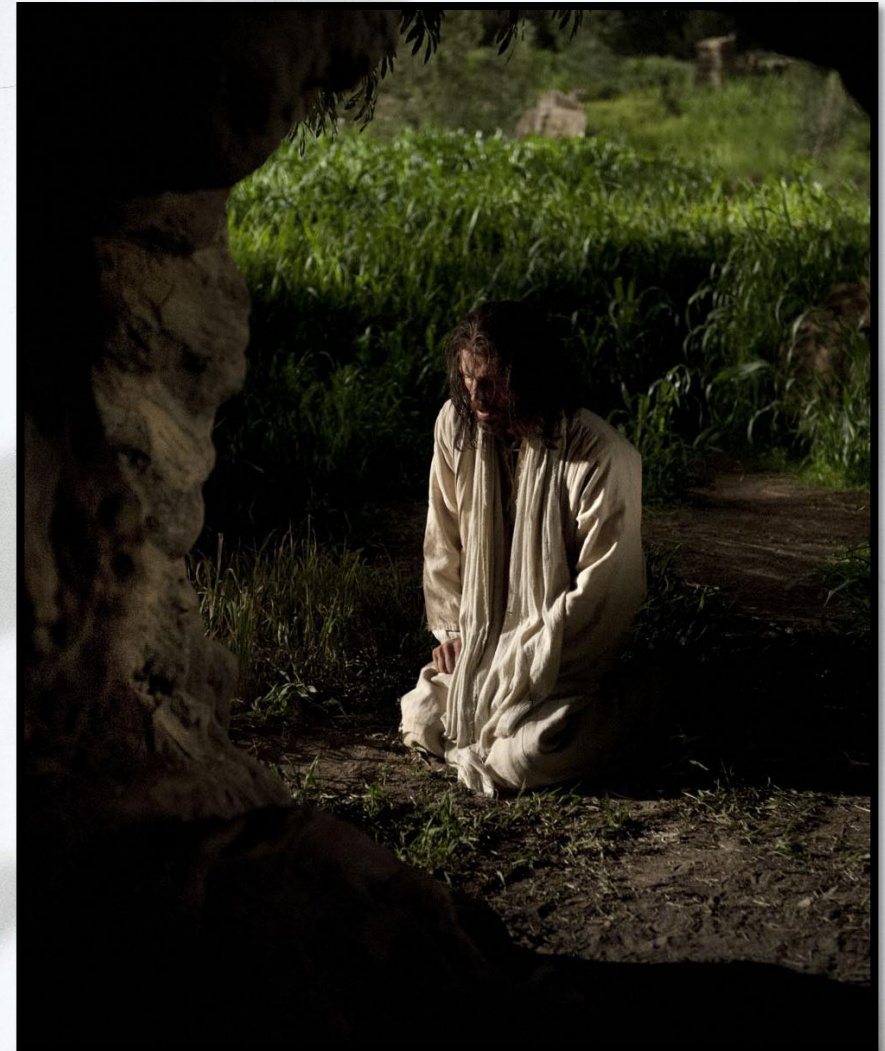
3. Jesus had a human soul and emotions

John 11:35

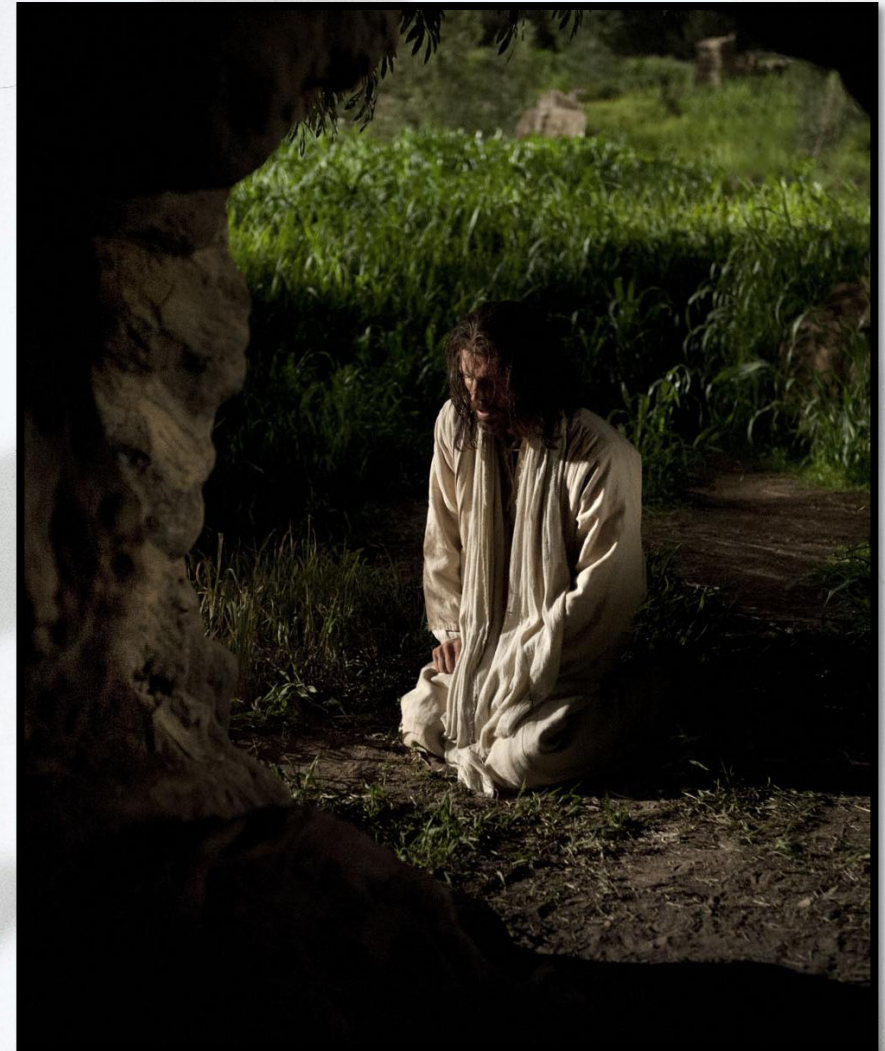
“Jesus wept.”



3. Jesus had a human soul and emotions

Hebrews 5:7

“During the days of Jesus’ life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions **with fervent cries and tears** to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.



4. Jesus is a sinless human being

- Satan unable to tempt get him to sin (Luke 4:13)
- Pilate find no basis for a charge against him (John 18:38)
- The book of Acts called him Holy & Righteous One (Acts 3:14;4:30 and 7:52)

*28 You are my God, and I will give thanks to you;
you are my God; I will extol you.*

*29 Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good;
for his steadfast love endures forever!*

Acts 7:55-56

“But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. “Look,” he said, “I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God.”

5. Jesus' human nature stays forever

Revelation 1:13-17

13 and among the lampstands was someone like a son of man, dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest.

14 The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire.

15 His feet were like bronze glowing in a furnace, and his voice was like the sound of rushing waters.

5. Jesus' human nature stays forever

Revelation 1:13-17

16 In his right hand he held seven stars, and coming out of his mouth was a sharp, double-edged sword. His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance.

17 When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last.

Matthew 26:29

“I tell you I will not drink from this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father’s kingdom.”

5. Jesus' human nature stays forever

Revelation 19:9

“Then the angel said to me, “Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb!” And he added, “These are the true words of God.”

C. Why did Jesus become human being?

1 John 4:2-3

“By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God; & every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God; this is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world.”

Why did Jesus become human?

1. **To be the One mediator between God & Man**

1 Timothy 2:5

“For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus,”

Why did Jesus become human?

2. For Representative Obedience

Romans 5:18-19

“Consequently, just as one trespass resulted in condemnation for all people, so also one righteous act resulted in justification and life for all people. For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.”

Why did Jesus become human?

1 Corinthians 15:45, 47

45 So it is written: “The first man Adam became a living being”; the last Adam, a life-giving spirit.

47 The first man was of the dust of the earth; the second man is of heaven.

Why did Jesus become human?

3. To be a Substitute Sacrifice

Hebrews 2:16-17

16 For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants.

17 For this reason he had to be made like them, fully human in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people.

Why did Jesus become human?

4. To fulfill God's purpose for man to rule over creation

Hebrews 2:8-9

8 You have put all things in subjection under his feet.” For in that He put all in subjection under him, He left nothing that is not put under him. But now we do not yet see all things put under him.

9 But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone.

Why did Jesus become human?

5. **To be our example**

Philippians 2:5-7

5 In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

7 rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

D. Living in the Light of Jesus' Human Nature

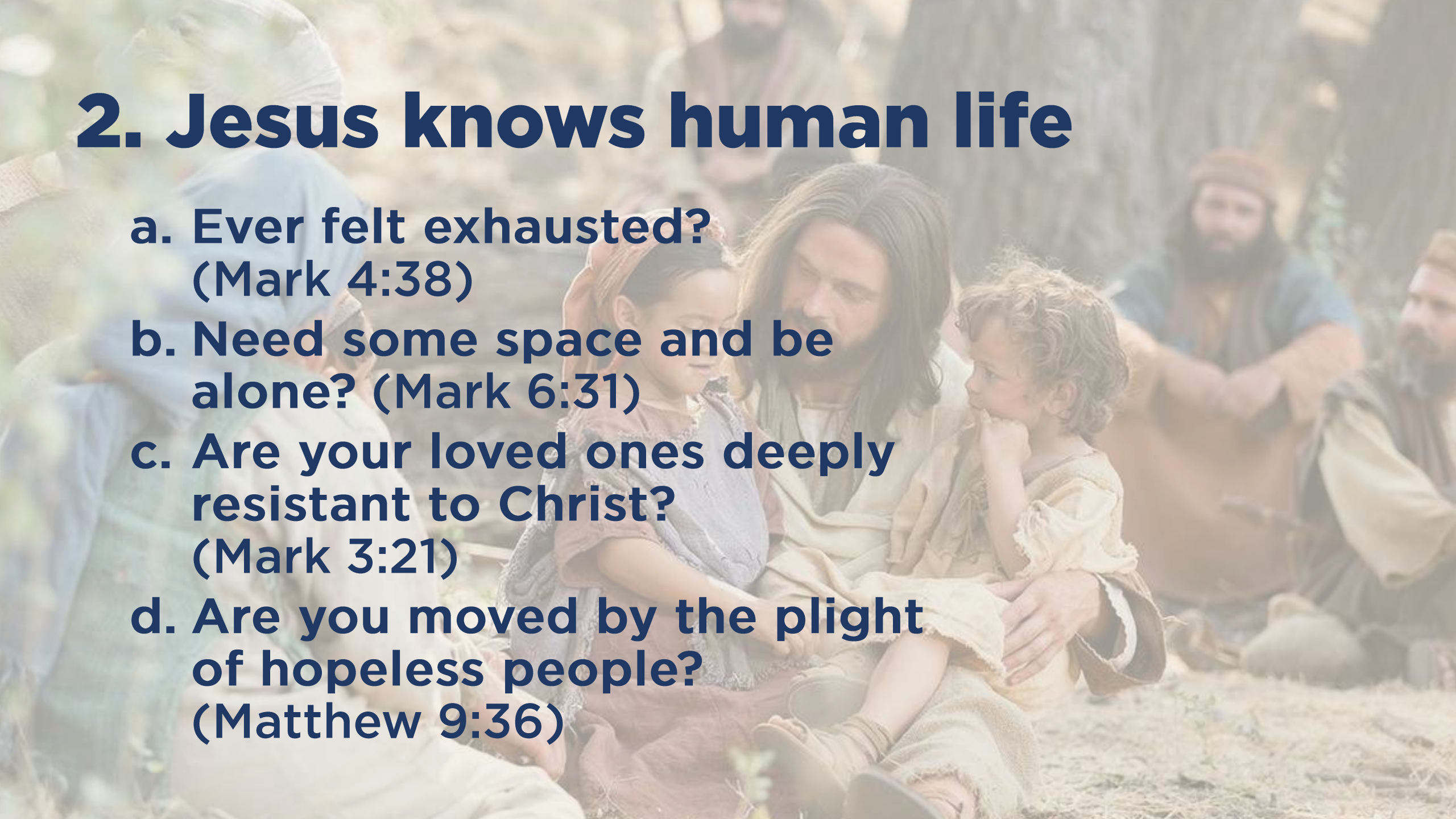
1. Grasp the humanity of the Son of God

Hebrews 4:15-16

“For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God’s throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.”

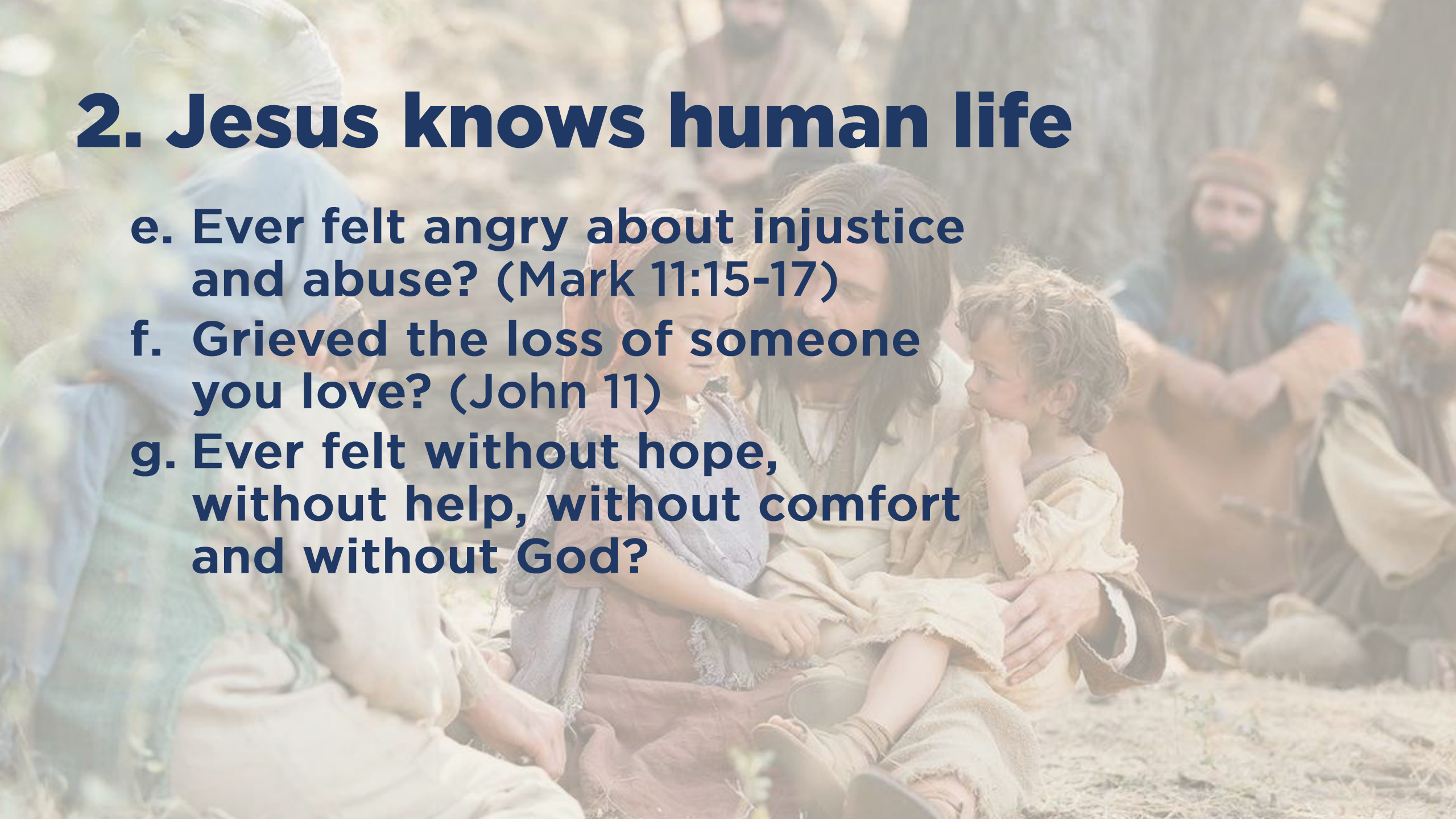
2. Jesus knows human life

alone? (Mark 6:31)**
- c. Are your loved ones deeply

(Mark 3:21)**

- e. Ever felt angry about injustice and abuse? (Mark 11:15-17)**
- f. Grieved the loss of someone you love? (John 11)**
