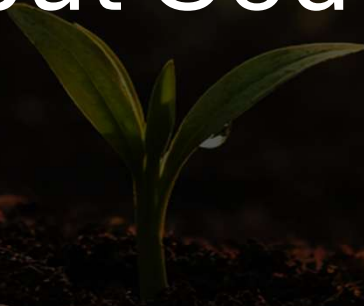
Acts 2:46-47 ESV

but God gave the growth.



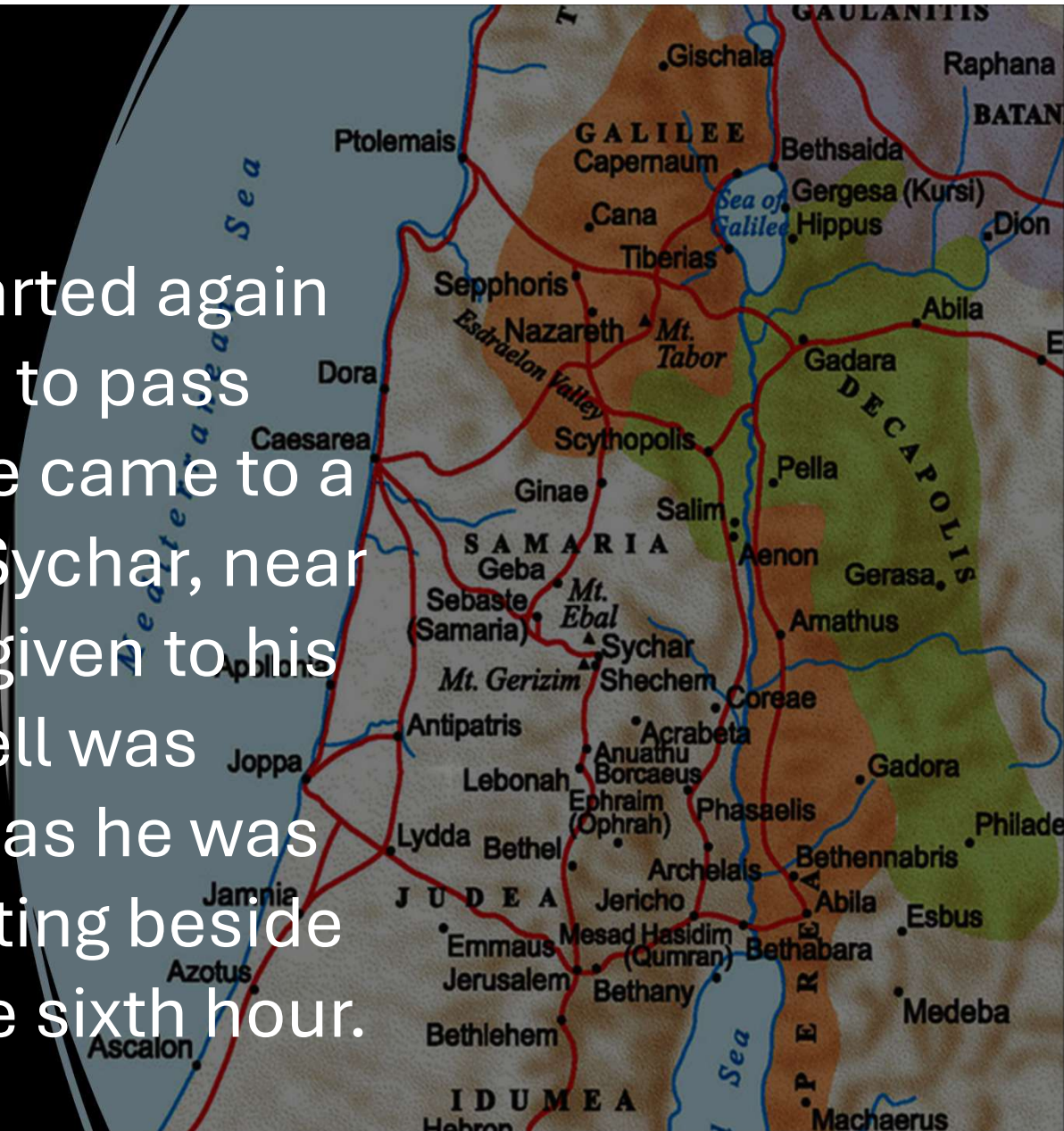
John 4: 13-14


